Food Insecurity can effect anyone, but it seems most troubling when it impacts kids and seniors.

195 unique kids and 110 unique seniors needed some help this year

This year 454 different households were helped (809 unique individuals). While households are eligible to get a hamper every month, 62% visited 6 times or less!

Sharing our perishables allows us to keep food waste to a minimum, while helping to reduce food Insecurity



Despite the pandemic in 2021, individuals, organizations, and businesses stepped up to organize events, food drives, and fundraisers!



Food Recovery is a large part of our work to increase food security! Since starting food recovery we have been able to provide more fresh produce, meat, and dairy! Pick ups at stores are done every day. Volunteers sort food, getting what we can't use off to other organizations, or to farmers if it is not suitable for human consumption.

This year local retailers donated more than 122,000 lbs of food that would have gone to the landfill, that equates to a savings of 105,142 kgs CO2 emissions
